# cott Smith In Concert

Sunday, October 20, 2013, 3:00 p.m.

Our October organ concert brings Scott Smith back to the organ bench at the Senate Theater.

Scott Smith is a native and life-long resident of Lansing, Michigan, where he studied both theatre and classical organ during his formative years. Beginning as a teenager, Scott performed regularly on the Barton organ at the Michigan Theatre in downtown Lansing as its last House Organist, from 1972 until the theatre's closing in 1980. When the organ's new home was secured at the Grand Ledge Opera House, Scott was responsible for the organ's redesign and oversaw its installation and tonal refinement. He has been House Organist there since 1995. Scott was one of the original incorporators of Lansing Theatre Organ in 1980 and has served as the organization's president since inception.

Throughout the years, Smith has performed concerts and accompanied silent films across the country. This concert marks his 11th concert for DTOS since first performing there in 1976 at age twenty-one. Each year around the holidays, Smith entertains shoppers on the Barton organ at the Mole Hole of Marshall, Michigan, where the 2013 Christmas season will mark his 25th consecutive year.

Smith is also a recording artist, with recordings produced at the Michigan Theatre (Lansing), The Mole Hole (Marshall) and Century II Convention Center (Wichita, Kansas). Another recording is currently in the works.

Scott has worked extensively in the field of pipe organ maintenance and restoration since high school, beginning when he joined the volunteer crew that restored and maintained the Barton organ in downtown Lansing's Michigan Theatre. Today, he is the owner of Scott Smith Pipe Organs, LLC, a full-service pipe organ business that services and restores both theatre and church/classical pipe His company has restored much of the DTOS Wurlitzer in recent years in collaboration with Holden

Pipe Organs of Ferndale.

Over the years, Smith has served DTOS in many capacities, including a stint on the Board of Directors several years ago. Today he is active as a member of both the Organ Trustee Committee and the Organ Committee, the latter of which faithfully tunes and maintains the Wurlitzer in the Senate Theatre. His name may be found amongst those of Honorary Member.

Beginning while still in his teens, Smith has become well known as an author of numerous articles relating to the pipe organ, published both in the Journal of the American Theatre Organ Society, and the former Console magazine. One of his earliest articles, written when he was only eighteen, was selected for publication in the ATOS technical guide book, "Theatre Organ Shop Notes," first pub-

lished in 1988 and still in print today. In 2002, Smith was awarded the Simonton Literary Award by the ATOS for his article, "The Butterfield Specials." Currently, he is in the process of research-

ing a book about the organ division of the famed W.W. Kimball Company, which produced quality pipe organs in the United States from 1896 to 1942.

Smith has lectured and/

or performed for numerous conventions of the American Institute of Organbuilders, Organ Historical Society and the American Theatre Organ Society. In July, 2014, he will perform at the national convention of the ATOS in Indianapolis.

Join us on October 20 at the Senate Theater. Doors open at 2:00 p.m., with the concert starting at 3:00 p.m.
