September's concert has someone that is very familiar around the Senate Theater. Dave Calendine has been on the Board of Directors for several years, and is the current Treasurer for the Detroit Theater Organ Society. He also creates this newsletter for the DTOS.

Dave is a big fan of almost anything Disney, and has decided to do a concert with a Disney theme. "Music of the Mouse" will be performed on the Mighty Wurlitzer theatre pipe organ at the Senate Theater on Sunday, September 11, at 3:00 p.m.

As part of the concert, there will be silent film cartoons shown that were done by Walt

Disney himself. These early cartoons were drawn before he came up with Mickey Mouse, and include a silent cartoon short that was never released to the general public.

Dave has been playing the piano since the age of three. At the age of twelve, he started showing interest in the organ at his church, teaching himself how to play the pedals, and the different sounds of each stop of the organ.

At the age of sixteen, he first heard a theatre organ, with Lyn Larsen at the console of the Wurlitzer organ at the Akron Civic Theatre. It was life-changing for him, and he set out to get his hands on the organ no matter the cost.

After begging the Akron Civic Theatre staff to let him in to try out the organ, he was given the chance after helping volunteer at a movie. He was only given twenty minutes to play after the movie, but he was in heaven. The next week, the manager of the theatre called and asked him to come on staff and play for shows. He remained active at the theatre for over three years.

Dave has performed throughout the country, and has performed in Canada, Germany and Switzerland. For his regular "daytime" job, Dave works for the Detroit Red Wings / Olympia Entertainment as their Operations Manager. As part of that job, he is organist at the Fox Theatre, Joe Louis Arena, and the soon-to-befinished-being-built Little Caesars Arena.

Come to the Senate Theater on September 11 to hear some of your favorite Disney songs, from the early days of Disney animation, to music from the theme parks, there will be lots of fun music to cover.

Doors open at 2:00 p.m., with the concert starting at 3:00 p.m. We look forward to seeing you at the Senate Theater as we resume our concert series after a hot summer off!

rtist Restroom Rebuild Progressing

Despite the heat, work to the artists' bathroom is well under way.

With the great help of plumber Bill Vought the sink, vanity and toilet were removed to find literally a disintegrated floor The entire old underneath. flooring has been removed and the concrete was cleaned with an agent to kill mold, fungus and other contaminates. By the time you read this the new floor will be down. Following expert advice there will be no subfloor laid. The adhesive is water resistant (except in extreme cases of hot water), the new floor is a sealed vinyl.

We have also removed all of the moulding and closet doors, which were washed. The door will be painted.

Everything, including the walls, will be washed prior to reinstalling the fixtures, which the plumber will do. A new seal and new bolts will be used on the toilet. I can assure anyone we will not find 'mushrooms' growing behind the toilet anytime soon and it will also be quite stable!

Cost to date has been under \$75 as we are doing most work ourselves and a plumber friend has volunteered his time.

Saturday, September 24 8:00 p.m.


